Ichanka Malbec, Mendoza, Argentina

\$19.99

A delicious Malbec that has more complexity than most at this price point. There's plenty of dark berry fruit, along with coffee, chocolate, earth and spice. It's rich and tasty and perfect with a grilled ribeye.

Backhouse Pinot Noir, California

\$19.99

It's hard to find really good Pinot Noir for under \$20 so it's a treat to taste the quality that Backhouse delivers for such a good price. This has real Pinot character with notes of cherry, rhubarb and wet earth.

Wishing Tree Shiraz, South Australia

\$17.99

This is a really interesting Shiraz that has more structure and is less overtly sweet than many inexpensive wines from this region. Expect notes of ripe plums, red berries and hints of mocha. A fun and tasty wine that's a terrific value.

La Vuelta Syrah, Mendoza Argentina

\$19.99

This is made from the same grape as the Wishing Tree but, as one would expect, the Syrah is a completely different style from the Shiraz. The La Vuelta shows off the earthy and peppery side of the grape. There's still excellent dark fruit flavor but the wine is definitely on savory side and that's a good thing. This is one of the best wines we have tasted at this price point.

Botijo Rojo Tinto, Spain

This granacha based wine is flat out delicious. There's a fascinating floral element to the wine, along with hints of tobacco and other dried herbs as well as notes of cherry, pomegranate and pepper. A wine that critic Antonio Galloni says is "very easy to drink."

Orchard Lane Sauvignon Blanc, New Zealand
