Faustino V11 Tempranillo, Rioja, Spain

\$18.99

Faustino makes some great wines and their entry level Tempranillo is no exception. This has classic notes of sour cherry, cigar box and herbs and finishes with some lovely dark berry fruit. It's a pleasure to drink something this complex at this price.

"Il Nespoli" Sangiovese, Emilia-Romagna, Italy

\$27.99

This Sangiovese is really something else. It drinks like a top-flight Chianti Classico Riserva but it's actually from nearby Emilia-Romagna. The wine features flavours of wild berries, white cherries and minerals. It's a beautifully balanced wine that's perfect with pizza and pasta.

Noble Vines 667 Pinot Noir, California

\$19.99

If there's a better value in California Pinot Noir I haven't seen it. The Noble Vines 667 is ripe but complex with notes of rhubarb, raspberry, wild mushrooms and freshly turned soil. It's amazing that Pinot Noir of this quality is available for under \$20.

Gunsight Rock Cabernet Sauvignon, Paso Robles, California

\$22.99

Gunsight Rock is made in a style similar to Liberty School or Seven Oaks. It's a delicious consumer friendly Cab that's loaded with dark berry fruit, chocolate and spice. The tannins are soft and the texture is smooth. This is a surefire crowd pleaser.

Carmen Gran Reserva Carmenere, Apalta, Chile

\$18.99

Chile is making some terrific wines but they are best known for the stellar values they produce. This has everything really good Carmenere should have. There's a nice balance between ripe red and black fruits and there's just a hint of bell pepper in the background. This is a fun wine to drink.

Dr L Dry Riesling, Mosel, Germany

\$17.99

If you think you know what inexpensive German Riesling tastes like then think again. Most are semi-sweet with tangy acidity providing some balance. However, this version of the Dr. L is bone dry. There's still plenty of acidity but there's no discernible sweetness on the palate. The wine is loaded with flavours of Granny Smith apples, lime zest and minerals. It's a fantastic match of pan seared scallops.

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
